Where are America's schoolchildren when it comes to knowledge of American History and subsequent civic responsibility? National testing results are continually evermore shocking... and though these data points are detailed herein (see Appendix), consider this sole summation: Less than 20% of high school graduates are competent in the fields of American History and Civics. More bluntly, more than 80% are "incompetent" in the essential fields of citizenship! As sobering as the nationwide statistics are, they still reflect only surface issues. The more paralyzing crisis is in the lack of a greater meta-narrative about our world and our place in it: a *worldview*. "Government by the people, for the people, and of the people" is only tenable when "We the people" are able to meet the core requirements of Liberty.

The moral timbre of America has also changed greatly over the past fifty years: There is now a prevailing philosophy espousing soft and malleable standards, particularly regarding primary education. Such notions rob children of their innate capacity and moral responsibility for choosing right over wrong. Instead of exhortations towards traditional virtue and academic excellence, many have chosen to lower the bar ~ offering only excuses for the ever-expanding egocentric behavior within recent and coming generations. Such a worldview neither grasps the human condition, nor does it possess essential understandings of the past. Past generations cultivated the greater culture by living and breathing time-honored virtues... days of hard work, earnestness, caring for family, friends and neighbors. Truth was not a personal inclination, but rather a universal demand. *PAL* simply returns to these fertile fields and healthy roots... our Founding Principles! We've read what Thomas Jefferson and Benjamin Franklin were achieving when they were boys. We've heard about the responsibilities our grandparents assumed when they were young. Lastly, we remember our own dreams as children ~ seeking to soar like eagles!

Though the national ethos presently suffers many devastating effects from the decades of postmodern indoctrination, our Founding Principles have not changed. The Solution

This should not be surprising, as America's Founding Principles are obviously not just efficacious for middle schoolers. These still "self-evident truths" are meant for all human beings! As a point of fact, many *PAL* teachers (and visiting parents) have experienced dramatic transformations in their own thinking... in their own lives... simply because of their immersion into ideas in the curriculum. Every tenet of *Project American Life* is anchored steadfastly and resolutely to the Founding Principles of our American Republic... straight from the everlasting Ideals of The Declaration of Independence. Here we find the source of continual inspiration and the strong foundation for building the long envisioned *City on a Hill*. America's Founders understood that Liberty is not mere subjective preference; but rather, it is a Divinely ordained condition for which human beings are designed. Although many quote Jefferson's words, "I swear eternal enmity against every form of tyranny," many do not realize that the quote continues: "...over the mind of man." Jefferson knew this kind of oppression was the root of human bondage. Therefore, it is vital, even essential, to keep minds active, thoughts keen and souls inspired... if they are to recognize the blinding veils that tyrants seek to pull over our eyes.

Young people are well-steeped in the cauldron of their "rights." They lay claim to a cornucopia of rights... and yet, they are woefully unable to substantiate such rights... as in "How do they have them?" or "Where did they get them?" Their mindset is the by-product of a culture fixated on individual autonomy and the elevation of self. However, "rights" such as these are not found in The Declaration. In Jefferson's treatise, there are two precise prerequisites to the existence of our "unalienable rights." Firstly, there must be a Source for such claims. Secondly, this Source must have ultimate authority... must be Sovereign. Otherwise, any claim would be just more conjecture in a sea of competing ideas. According to The Declaration, "rights" do not come from the opinions of other mortals. Rather, our "rights" depend solely upon the durable will and transcendent design of our "Creator."

Yet in today's America, there is a prevailing sentiment insisting there is something dreadfully wrong with informing students of these Founding Principles. The Constitutional phrase regarding the "establishment of religion" is often misappropriated as a means of intimidating anyone challenging the secular status quo. However, precisely what religion is established in the term "Creator?" Not only is a religion not established; one is not even identified. It is indeed astounding to note how such logic has taken the field. Words like "rights" are thrown around as if such foundational ideas have always triumphed in human affairs. This is only possible because of the overwhelming presence of historical illiteracy, intellectual incoherence and moral cowardice among the citizenry. For the history of man has repeatedly demonstrated the exact opposite of these prevailing assumptions. Thus, we must be comprehensive and precise when considering America's Founding Principles... the solid ground upon which all of us are now standing. Viva Liberte'!

Possibilities

For the past decades, there has been continuous astonishment regarding *PAL's* ability to engage children on highly elevated cognitive and developmental levels. America is in crisis... one of heart, mind, and soul, particularly among the young. Why are today's students lagging far behind their predecessors despite more educational funding than ever? How did they become so woefully ignorant of our history, our civic duty, our unique heritage? More to the point, what happened to the intrinsic elements of being a child: innocence, curiosity and dreams? In today's America, pop culture incessantly engenders chasms in coherent thinking and voids in applied reason. So, why are we surprised when chaos is normative... when long-standing institutions have become ineffectual? For educators, how do we now teach? What can we employ to bridge chasms... fill voids... and restore tranquility?

Learning, if it is to be lasting and real, must first engage! Only then are we able to assist in the development of requisite understandings... and integrated thought processes. As always, it is the larger meta-narrative that generates the essential hunger... the animating zeal towards discovery. Herein, learners begin honing their own skills... consciously choosing the lenses through which they see the world. C.S. Lewis clarifies, "To see through everything is the same as seeing nothing." Rather than unfocused meanderings, meaningful education must touch the heart, invigorate the mind, and inspire the soul. *PAL's* experiential method provides spirited opportunities to discover core truths as well as organize a framework of thinking.

As teachers, our charge is to educate in a way that recognizes and respects our inherent state of being: Free men and women. Here, *PAL* rekindles the cognitive process using Socratic inquiry. Students critically evaluate presumptions in search of solid answers. Fortunately, this is not a laborious task. Little children naturally pick up every foreign object, study every previously unknown face, and ask every conceivable question. Reinvigorating this "passion to know" must be our perpetual aim; thus, each day revolves around questions that are both personal and profound: *Who am I? What am I? Where am I? Why am I?* These questions and the corresponding activities come together to awaken the curiosity with which we are born.

To meet today's challenges, teachers must come to clear and impassioned agreement that knowledge of history is vital to Liberty's survival. In this, we must understand that there are many varied roads to be traveled... new discoveries to be made... and absolute facts to be found! Students may rightly think, "Okay, John Hancock was first to sign *The Declaration*. So what?! What difference does this make? Why should we care?" Bits and pieces of information are not meaningful if a student is unable to see their relationship to the bigger picture. How can she appreciate today's opportunities if she has no understanding of yesterday's struggles? Strong foundations of the intransigent past provide ever-present springboards for soaring imaginations!

Bricks are the facts and Mortar is the thinking process. Using The Declaration of Independence and The Constitution as textual foundations, PAL addresses questions of meaning and purpose... how we relate to one another... how we fit into the greater historical context. Building upon this bedrock, we are able to illumine the Founding Principles of America. As in 1776, these truths become self-evident as students delve into the Four Cs of Citizenship: Clarity • Compassion • Courage • Commitment. Herein, they find an enduring blueprint for our most unique Democratic Republic. The starting point is quite revolutionary: "We the people!"

Over half a century ago, C.S. Lewis wrote the classic series about the world of Narnia. Lewis only offered one sentence regarding how the Golden Age was governed: "And they made good laws and kept the peace... and liberated young dwarfs and young satyrs from being sent to school..." Wow, one of the top priorities was to keep the young from attending school! Since Lewis was a professor at Cambridge, it is not logical to assume he despised his own profession. Instead, what is clear is that he was well aware of what was generally being taught within the educational establishment. In *The Lion, the Witch, and the Wardrobe*, when the other children do not believe Lucy's reports of a world beyond the wardrobe, Professor Kirk grumbles, "I wonder what they do teach them at these schools." Lewis knew that modern education was focused upon instituting a new order of conformity rather than generating awe, wonder, logic, and the subsequent hunger for the truth that they inspire. Imagine what he would think today!

As in a healthy garden, growth requires two vital components ~ tilling and planting. Clearly, scattering the seed is the preferred job, as it is more easily accomplished. Also, sowing contains the confidence that the fruits will soon be at hand... that is, if someone has already done the hard job of tilling. For unless the ground is broken up and the rocks removed, planting is a near pointless exercise. Without proper preparations, the seeds have little chance to take root. Likewise, as long as a student is convinced of his own adequacy, even superiority, there is little room for new information. Hunger precedes the feast! There is a prerequisite to all education... the desire to know. When such desire is absent, teachers must be willing to serve as tillers... to open untapped regions of the mind... to remove the rocky debris of malignant hubris and blinding indoctrination. Tragically, this necessary tilling is often dismissed in favor of providing only predigested vegetables to students... a process of intellectual incapacitation... and a cauldron of bias. As teachers, our duty is to empower students with the skills to become proficient gardeners themselves... free men and women able to seize the American Dream!

Modern philosophies suggest children not be made to feel uncomfortable... or suffer any negative consequences. There are teachers who do not correct tests with red pens, as they believe such harsh ink might injure the students' self-esteem. Here, we must be clear about terms like "self-esteem," "uncomfortable" or "negative." If the goal is protecting students from distressing fears, painful embarrassments, and disabling requirements beyond their grasp, surely all sensible people concur. However, if students must now be shielded from realities of birth and death, good and evil, sacrifice and cruelty, and the tragic history of mankind, then students are being inherently robbed of opportunities to develop vital life skills: clarity... courage... wisdom. We all will face heartless enemies as well as bitter disappointments. Genuine teachers provide students efficacious tools for overcoming such potentially paralyzing wolves (in sheep's clothing or not). Isn't it imperative that students realize such wolves exist (since they do)? And more, such adversaries can be defeated! Here, clarity is found; courage is seized; wisdom is gained.
